1. Talk about a time when God used someone to help you grow in your faith.
2. Jim Rohn says that we become the average of the five people we spend the most time with. Do you agree or disagree, why or why not?
3. Read Proverbs 13:20. How do you determine the difference between someone who is wise or foolish?
4. Read 1 Corinthians 15:33. Can you recall a time when someone you know (or perhaps even yourself) started spending time with a person who was a bad influence? What was the outcome?
5. How can you make certain that you are spending the most time with wise and godly people without coming across as snobbish, judgmental or aloof toward people who are not wise or godly?
6. Pastor Mark points out that the church cannot create good friendships, but we can create environments where good friendships can develop. Can you point to a time where you made good friends through the church? How did that impact your life?
7. How can parents help their children and teenagers learn to be discerning and intentional when it comes to choosing a peer group?
8. Can you recall a time when God used you as a positive Christian influence in the life of someone else?
9. We are living in a culture where people statistically have fewer close relationships than previous generations. Why do you think that is?
